# A Taste of Nova Scotia

## Highlights

### Halifax

A very accessible city, compact and full of history and experiences

### Lunenburg

Home to the replica of Bluenose fishing schooner (featured on the Canadian 10 cent coin) and a UNESCO historic site.

### Cape Breton Island

Full of ancient Celtic culture with historic villages tree covered mountains and magnificent valleys.

### Cabot Trail

One of the most beautiful scenic drives in the world carved into mountains that rise above the shimmering waters of the Gulf of St Lawrence.

### Lighthouse Route

Follows the southern shoreline west through coastal villages and idyllic inlets.

### Tidal Bore

Watch the tidal bore and ride the waves on the Shubenacadie River.

The proximity of Nova Scotia to the UK makes it great for a short break as well as a more relaxed and extended stay. With Halifax closer to the UK than to Vancouver on the west coast, direct flights average under 5½ hours from London; similar to the eastern Mediterranean. The sparse population, under 1 million people in an area 2½ times the size of Wales (pop 3m), means there is space to relax and outside of Halifax little traffic.

This introduction to the charms and culture of Nova Scotia takes in Halifax, and then the Lighthouse Route to the historic town of Lunenburg. Cross the peninsula to the Bay of Fundy and then east to Cape Breton Island via Pictou, with its Scottish heritage. Return to Halifax along the southern Marine Drive for an evening flight.

## Highlights

### Kejimikujik National Park

A gem of a national park that can be explored by boat, by bike or by foot.

### Annapolis Royal

A captivating blend of heritage and charm with Fort Anne Historic Site overlooking the Annapolis river.

### Louisbourg

A magnificent 'French' town; Fortress Louisbourg is the largest historic reconstruction in North America.

### Grand Pre

Wine and Acadian heritage.

### Digby

Famous for scallops and for whale watching in the Bay of Fundy. Spectacular scenic drive along Digby Neck and Islands.

### Kayaking around the Islands off Prospect or around Mahone Bay.

Wonderfully relaxing and with beautiful scenery.

After time exploring Halifax follow the southern shoreline east via Salmon River Bridge to Cape Breton Island and Dundee overlooking Bras d'Or Lakes. Then across the Island or via the National Historic Site of Louisbourg (90 mile detour) joining the Cabot Trail and the Highlands National Park.

Back west along the Sunrise Trail via Pictou to Tatamagouche on the Northumberland Strait. Across the Isthmus of Chignecto taking in the tidal bore on the Shubenacadie River caused by the the world's highest tides and on to Wolfville near to Cape Blomidon and the Acadian town of Grand Pre. On to Digby famed for scallops and whale watching and then around the coast to Shelburne. Follow the Lighthouse Trail to Mahone Bay and Oak Island with a detour to the Kejimikujik National Park. Then along the bays and inlets of the south shore to Halifax.
