San Pedro Riparian Conservation Area

This unique habitat is home to over 335 species of birds, 82 species of mammals and 47 species of amphibian and reptile.

Tombstone

Re-enactments of the shoot-out staged at the real OK Corral or tour the dusty streets by stagecoach.

Saguaro National Park

See the world's largest stand of towering Saguaro Cacti and fascinating petroglyphs on Tucson's doorstep.

Scenic Drives

Apache Trail Historic Road (Phoenix to Globe)

View steep sided canyons, rock outcrops and magnificent geological formations.

Swift Trail Parkways (near Safford)

Offering breathtaking views from Mount Graham.

Coronado Trail (Alpine to Clifton)
Weaving its way across the wooded ridges of eastern Arizona.

Southern Arizona

Travelling from Phoenix, drive to Prescott which is a charming historic town nestled in the beautiful landscape of The Granite Dells. Payson is close to immense stands of pine, numerous lakes and streams. You can experience a diverse range of canyons, woodlands and lakes in Sitgreaves National Forest while driving to Alpine ('The Alps of Arizona'). Driving south to Safford is a route called 'The Coronado Trail', known as the 'White Knuckle Road' it meanders through the impressive scenery of eastern Arizona. After sampling the wild west history of Tombstone travel to Tucson via San Pedro Riparian Conservation Area with its wide variety of birds, mammals and reptiles. North to Globe on the edge of Tonto National Forest a town with strong links to Arizona's past where you can browse antique and gift shops. The drive then takes you west back to Phoenix and The Valley of the Sun.

Sedona

Chic small town and artists mecca set amongst towering red rocks.

Monument Valley

Soaring sandstone monoliths and cliff formations.

Grand Canyon

A 2 billion year old formation offering jaw dropping scenery.

Lake Powell

The blue green waters are perfect for boating, with Rainbow Arch and Antelope Canyon nearby.

Phoenix-Scottsdale

Impressive metropolis with many cultural attractions and museums as well as close to the Sonora desert.

Scenic Drives

Grand Canyon Loop

The road takes you through pine forests and flatlands to the world famous Grand Canyon.

Red Rock Country

From Sedona explore the steep desert hills and cloistered canyons at the heart of Arizona.

Leaving Phoenix drive the scenic route through Tonto National Forest and explore the ranges of impressive vegetation. Take in the views of Sitgreaves National Forest that range from 3000ft - 11000ft on your way to Holbrook. From here visit The Petrified Forest National Park where vistas of green desert contrast with the red and purple of the mountains. Chinle resides at the entrance of the impressive Canyon de Chelly, ideal to trace the history of Native Americans. West of the canyon lies Kayenta from where you can reach Monument Valley with its landscape of purple, reds and golds. Boating takes on new dimensions at Lake Powell with its 186 mile long waterway. Travelling south sees The Grand Canyon; the natural wonder offers a unique panorama and is the 'Crown Jewel' of Arizona. After passing through the famous red rocks of Sedona travel south back to Phoenix.
