Highlights

Asheville

Charming downtown with art deco buildings restaurants and galleries.

Biltmore Estate

Built at the end of the 19th century, stands as a monument to Vanderbilt wealth including parkland, gardens and winery.

Blue Ridge Parkway

A purpose built 470 mile tourist road from the Great Smokey Mountains offering tremendous views and scenery.

Old Salem

An 18th century living Museum.

Outer Banks

A string of narrow islands including small towns and national monuments.

Wilmington

The State's principal port with 230 block historic district and eclectic collection of buildings from many eras.



From Charlotte the drive climbs north into the Blue Ridge Mountains and Asheville with all its distinctive charm. Nearby is the Biltmore Estate and the Blue Ridge Parkway. Drag yourself away from Asheville to the Historic Community of Winston-Salem and on to Durham and the State Capital of Raleigh.

From here move on to the Coast, near the Outer Banks and the site of the first British settlements on Roanoke Island, at Manteo. The drive along this remarkable coastline via New Bern to Wilmington and Cape Fear is fascinating. Wilmington has one of the nations largest historic commercial districts, extending over 200 blocks. The journey then continues north returning to Charlotte.

The first night of the holiday is in The Olde English District of South Carolina with picture postcard pretty towns.

Then head west 'upcountry' following the Cherokee Foothills Scenic Byway from Gaffney. The region has wonderful scenery and Indian heritage. The route then follows the Savannah River National Scenic Byway down to Augusta and Aiken in Thoroughbred Country where a blend of museums and stately houses detail the area's unique architecture. On to the coast at Charleston, which has had a starring role in South Carolinas history for over 300 years and then to Georgetown with its opulent townhouses and rich antebellum past.

- 3nts 150 miles to Pickens, The Schell Haus
- 2nts 155 miles to Aiken, The Crossways Plantation
- 3nts 140 miles to Charleston, The Kings Courtyard
- 2nts 60 miles to Georgetown, Harbor House
- 220 miles to Charlotte Airport



Highlights

Charleston

Barely changed historic district with 73 pre-revolution buildings. Cobble streets lined with boutique shops, art galleries and restaurants offering a taste of the Old South.

Georgetown

Seen as little Charleston and the ghost capital of the south.

Drives

Cherokee Foothills National Scenic Byway

Through National forests with the Blue Ridge escarpment looming majestically beyond.

Savannah River Scenic Drive

Through beautiful country and quaint towns along the state border.

Ashley River Scenic Byway

This drive goes past some of the South's best preserved historic sites including Drayton Hall, Magnolia Gardens and Middleton Place.
