Through the Park, follow the Colorado River Headwaters Scenic Byway and on to Steamboat Springs, a year round resort nestling in the mountains of Northwest Colorado. The route then passes the Dinosaur National Monument and south to Grand Junction, the gateway to Colorado's Canyonlands and Wine Country, along the Dinosaur Diamond Prehistoric Highway. Continue on your journey to the famous Hot Springs and Glenwood Caverns Adventure Park in Glenwood Springs and then on to the ski resort of Breckenridge taking a detour along Top of the Rockies Scenic Byway and via the quaint old mining town of Leadville. From Breckenridge the route then returns to the Mile High City of Denver.

WYOMING 80 miles to Denver

Starting from the gateway city of Denver the journey south runs along the foot of the Rockies to Colorado Springs with its backdrop of Pikes Peak and The Garden of the Gods then west up into the mountains to the old gold mining town of Cripple Creek. Follow part of the Gold Belt Scenic Byway south to Alamosa and the Great Dunes National Park. Head west to the scenic mountain town of Durango with its famous narrow gauge railway. Visit nearby Mesa Verde National Park. The route then follows the San Juan Scenic Byway north past towering 14,000ft peaks to Ouray and on to Gateway on the Dolores River. From here turn back east following part of the West Elk Loop to Aspen and then return for some time in Denver.
