Highway 12

Combining history, nature and scenic beauty this route provides a showcase of sculptures.



Arrive in Salt Lake City to start your tour. With its combination of opulent mansions, public art and shopping, this city rivals those twice its size. Drive north to Logan nestled in the heart of Cache Valley with its historic architecture and unique shops. The drive from Logan Canyon to Bear Lake passes under imposing cliffs and dense green forests to the turquoise waters of the lake. Meander the dramatic canyon scenery through Laketown and Flaming Gorge's impressive red canyon to Vernal, gateway to Dinosaur National Monument. Cross through Uintah Ouray Indian Reservation and skirt the edge of Manti La Sal National Forest providing a stunning backdrop to your journey. Capitol Reef National Park has spectacular views of red rocks in contrast to the alpine forest you have just left. Entering the greenery of Dixie National Forest you arrive in Bryce Canyon where sunrise offers light gold hues changing to red, pink and purple as the sun sets. Explore small villages and scenery on your way to famous Las Vegas and your flight home.

Arrive in Las Vegas for the start of your drive. Soak up the atmosphere or take an optional flight over the Grand Canyon. From here your journey heads north east to Springdale with its art galleries and restaurants nestled in the shadow of Zion National Park. Travelling towards the vivid blue waters of Lake Powell you skirt the edge of Grand Staircase Escalante's National Monument. Entering Navajo Indian Country and its bleak desert landscapes you arrive in Monument Valley where you can admire the dramatic sandstone formations dominating the skyline. After spending two nights in Bluff, near to the Four Corners, head north to Moab via Monticello and the contrasting pine woods of Manti La Sal. Explore Arches and Canyonlands National Parks with their unique and dramatic views. After an overnight in Price head north to explore Salt Lake City before your flight home.
